

Libra Collections Policy January 2018

Libra allows University of Virginia scholars to make completed versions of their work—such as preprints and published articles—freely available to the general public for research, scholarship, teaching and learning, and to store their work in a central, stable location. The repository makes research more visible to a wider audience and helps assure the long-term preservation of UVA scholars' works.

While Libra has been developed specifically as an open access repository for scholarly works such as articles, books, and datasets authored by the UVA community, other works may be deposited as well, as long as sufficient rights have been retained by the author or authors.

Dissertations and theses of graduating UVA students from participating schools and departments are added to Libra and made available on a long-term basis as a replacement for paper copies added to the Library's shelves.

Items generated by the UVA community accepted for deposit in Libra include:

- Electronic theses and dissertations (including PDF and other department-approved formats such as HTML and multimedia)
- Scholarly articles in formats permitted by publisher and self-archiving policies listed in SHERPA/RoMEO
- Conference papers and posters
- Technical reports
- Datasets, or other products of research, suitable for open access (e.g. sets of images, records, quantitative, and qualitative data)
- Grey literature (e.g., blog posts, Twitter logs, non-published talks and presentations)
- Descriptions and links to persistent identifiers (e.g., DOI) for data stored in re3data.org-reviewed repositories which meet the following criteria: Copyright held by a UVA-affiliated author, Open Access, persistent identifier, and re3data.org-reviewed. - Descriptions and links to persistent identifiers (e.g., DOI) for products of research stored in discipline-based and institutional repositories which meet the following criteria: Copyright held by a UVA-affiliated author, Open Access, persistent identifier, and hosted by an R1 or scholarly society (e.g., ArXiv, OSF pre-prints, MLA Commons, PubMed)
